


RIVERSIDE REFLECTIONS

Greetings in Christ! I hope this edition of *The Spire* finds you well as we approach the end of another year. 2025 has been a busy one for many of us and there is plenty still to come in these final few weeks.

It was wonderful, with members, past members, clergy and friends of the parish, recently to celebrate 150 years since the All Saints' foundation stone was laid. I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to the planning committee, all those who helped in any way and all who attended this special event. What a privilege to thank the Lord for His goodness and faithfulness to our church community, worship Him in Christ-centred song, reflect on His Word and pray for future guidance, growth and blessing. Then, over a delicious morning tea in the Parish Hall, we had the opportunity to catch up with old friends, make some new ones and view photos and other items which bear witness to the long and rich history of our parish.

I am grateful to the Right Reverend Dr Mark Short, our Diocesan Bishop and the new Primate of the Anglican Church of Australia, for taking the time, along with his wife Dr Monica Short, to be with us on this special occasion. Bishop Mark gave a message full of Spirit-filled encouragement and challenge for us. Expounding 1 Peter 2:4-10, he reminded us of the truth that God's presence dwells not in buildings, but in His people – all those who trust in His Son. The Lord Jesus is the living, chosen and precious Cornerstone of our faith and the church. The “stone the builders rejected” (Psalm 118:22; 1 Pet. 2:7), the One who died at Calvary for our sins, is the One God triumphantly raised from the dead and He lives today, holding all things together. All who trust in Christ will never be put to shame, and are indwelt by His Spirit, transformed into living stones who are being made into a spiritual building. That temple is infinitely more important than the physical structures in which we gather. As Bishop Mark pointed out, it is “Christ-founded, Christ-centred mission which gives the church a stable and certain future.”

While it was great to have so many people join us for these celebrations, it is sad that we don't see anywhere near those kinds of numbers on a regular basis. Although we rightly celebrate the good things of the past, we must also pray for spiritual and numerical growth in the present and into the future. Already this year we have seen a few new faces at church in answer to prayers, showing that nothing is impossible with God. We must commit ourselves to boldly, faithfully, lovingly and creatively proclaiming Christ.

With all that in mind, it is with great excitement that I draw your attention to a new service starting on Sunday 16 November! *'The Well'* is designed to be a relaxed church gathering for all ages, with structure, but fresh, intentional and Spirit-led uplifting worship, Biblical, Christ-centred teaching, and a fun kids' program, with afternoon tea or dinner to follow. The name of this new congregation brings to mind the Lord's encounter with a Samaritan woman at a well, in John 4. As that passage reminds us, Christ is the only One who can satisfy our thirsty souls, giving us the living water of eternal life, joy and peace in Him.

'The Well' will be held at 4.00pm every Sunday (unless otherwise specified) at the Parish Hall. Please pray that this new ministry will help our church bear more good fruit in our community, encouraging the faithful and inviting more people into a living relationship with God through the Lord Jesus. Finally, as we head into December, we have various Christmas activities and services taking place in our parish (see pp.3 & 11 for more details). All are very welcome to join us for any or all of these, and please prayerfully invite others to come along as well. May you and your loved ones have a blessed Christmas and New Year, as we celebrate the perfect gift: God's love and grace to us in His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.




ANGLICAN NEWS



NEW PRIMATE FOR THE ANGLICAN CHURCH IN AUSTRALIA

On 19 July 2025 at an electoral meeting of the General Synod, the Right Reverend Dr Mark Short, currently Bishop of the Diocese of Canberra Goulburn, was elected as the 18th Primate of the Anglican Church in Australia. He officially took up his new duties on 1 November, whilst also continuing in the role of our Diocesan Bishop. As Primate, Bishop Mark is the spiritual leader of the Anglican Church in Australia, representing the Church nationally and internationally, especially at the Anglican Communion Primates' meeting. There will be a celebration with Bp Mark in the Cathedral Church of St Saviour in Goulburn on 14 February 2026.



Please pray for Bishop Mark and Monica as he extends himself into this dual role.

TUMUT COMMUNITY PANTRY REPORT

The magnificent effort of the *Tumut Takes 2* Fundraising concert has resulted in a donation to the Pantry of \$6772.05 from Chris Bowles and Jeneane Comans who chose us as their charity to support. Christmas is approaching and we have just ordered 120 basic Christmas hampers from Foodbank at a cost of \$3000 - we will add to and expand these as required.



An essential ongoing support of the Pantry is the donation of cash and non-perishable groceries. These can be dropped off at your local Tumut church, at Ray White Real Estate office or PRD office (both in Wynyard Street) or the *Hippy Cowgirl* in Capper Street. Alternatively, these and any fresh produce can be dropped off at the Pantry (Uniting Church Hall) on Friday morning (8.45am-12nn). At the same time you can check out what our volunteers do and decide whether to offer to join the team! The Pantry is open to clients each Friday from 10am to 12nn.

PARISH BITS AND PIECES

The facilities at All Saints' are for use by Parish members and by members of the general community. Whether you are looking for office space, space to host a family gathering, or a venue for a larger gathering (such as a wedding) please consider what is available for hire/lease at All Saints'. To discuss/inspect these facilities please contact Lorraine on 0427 471 722.

COMMUNITY HUB. *This comfortable, clean and air conditioned facility is used on a regular basis by a couple of community groups but there is ample opportunity for individuals or groups to make a booking to use it for their activities, either one-off or on a regular basis. Meeting space is available, office space also, kitchen facilities and comfortable heating/cooling. There is parking available close by and the building is accessible by ramp.*

PARISH HALL. *This large space is served by excellent kitchen space (soon to be renovated), stage facilities, a smaller meeting room, air conditioning and accessible facilities. The building is accessible by ramp.*

RIVERSIDE CHAPEL. *A beautiful area in the grounds of All Saints' has been developed as an outdoor chapel, used for weddings, meditation and personal celebrations. It is adjacent to and facing the Tumut River, enjoying the calm and beauty of the natural surroundings.*

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH. *This magnificent worship space, designed by Edmund Blacket and built 150 years ago, provides not only worship space and space for private meditation and prayer, but also a touch of tradition for your wedding celebration.*

HOLY ADVENT TUMORROMA

One of the joys of sharing in our Parish life is found in visits to the worshipping congregations in our outcentres. The worshipping members of the Church of the Holy Advent in Tumorrroma will celebrate their patronal festival at a service on Advent Sunday, 30 November 2025, at 11.30am, followed by a shared picnic lunch. Each year they invite worshippers from All Saints' to join them and each year it is a great occasion of fellowship in worship and social gathering - take along a picnic lunch and drink to suit your needs, a chair to sit on in the grounds of the church and the willingness to share the fun. There are often some Christmas treats to share too! Transport can be arranged.

PASTORAL CARE

Without honest, dedicated and intentional Pastoral Care a church community will flounder as it ceases to be truly relational.

Pastoral care is an essential ingredient of the church's ministry. A key ingredient of Pastoral Care is the art of listening, not just dialoguing and responding in conversation, but truly, actively listening to another.

*"One of the most precious and powerful gifts we can give another person is to really listen to them, to listen with quiet fascinated attention, with our whole being, fully present."*¹

For some, this comes readily and easily, for others we need to work at it, listening rather than talking or thinking about what you need to say.

Sometimes there will be silences, but we don't need to rush to fill the silence with needless words.

*"The power of silence is the power to slow things down, to give us the chance to reflect on what is happening, to listen to the collective wisdom, and to be present."*¹

At All Saints', Tumut, we have a very active Pastoral Care Team. Each individual contributes to the whole in a very personal way, true to their individual gifting from God. There are many who visit others or meet for coffee or a meal; those who phone others, especially in times of illness or personal life's challenges. Showing care and consideration for others is an essential in guiding relationships, especially in an ever increasingly, personally distanced world of technological advancements.

Pastoral care is open to all, in your own way, according to your individual gifting. We need to care firstly for those in our own community, but also for those in the wider community, building relationships in the way that Jesus taught us, with those we easily relate to, and with those out of our comfort zone.

Our Pastoral Care Team meets monthly at the Riverside Cafe for prayer, coffee/tea and a chat. Please join us if you feel this is something you'd like to grow within yourself.




